


THE PROJECT BRIEF:

The interior design is intended to reinforce the architectural design concept, which is flow. The flow of the water, the flow of the time are easily denoted by the curves of the building. They also welcome the user and "call" them to release their stress and enjoy their time in the leisure centre. The materials and the earthy colours allow the user to feel relaxed and familiar with the place. The anti-slip finishes, where required, have been carefully selcected to meet safety requirements. The portrait format in wall finishes absorb the curves and create an elegant style. Additionally, the natural colours allow for the operator's projection in the space when needed.

CHALLENGES & RESPONSIBILITIES:


I was responsible for the interior design as requested by the contractor and British building regulations. I assisted the architectural team during stages 4 and 5.




The purpose of the design is to improve the functionality and the appearance of the existing leisure centre and in parallel to extend its use with additional studios, a larger fitness suite and a soft play area. The project aims to improve the quality of the services to the users and to upgrade the residential area.

Many elements of the existing building had to be maintained or renovated and at the same time had to be combined with the proposed concept. 

Free hand sketches of the soft play and the dry change











The client needed to extend the existing house in order to improve their quality of life. The main need was to relocate the kitchen in order to make it bigger and to include it in a larger living area where the whole family could carry out their everyday activities and also host friends.

The concept was to extend the lounge area into the garden to make the most of warm sunny days. Skylights were incorporated to take advantage of the natural light. The first floor was also reconfigured with a new master ensuite bedroom, the original becoming a second/guest bedroom. . The interior design has followed the client's needs and preferences. The selected colour palette was warm with twicks of intense colours.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

The main responsibilities were to interpret the client's needs. The planning permission has been approved and the project is currently under construction.

The aim was to design a house for the accommodation of a two-child family. The residence is 170sq.m. and it consists of the ground floor, the upper floor, and the basement. On the ground, floor there is the living room, the kitchen and a guest room with a w.c. On the upper floor, there are two bedrooms (master bedroom and a smaller bedroom) with ensuite bathrooms. From this floor, there is access to the terrace. In the basement, there is a garage, a mechanical room for the pool and heating, a w.c. and a laundry

room.

CHALLENGES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

The team was responsible for the design according to the owner's preference and the existing building regulations. A building permit was approved for this residence in 2015.

Space Area: 170 sq.m. design date: 08/2014-03/2015 Status: Complete, 2016



The brief was to develop a new build of residential apartments in a quiet residential district for development. The position and the shape of the site, led the team to design two blocks of flats (at the front and back of the site) and locate the circulation services in the middle of the blocks. Thus, better lighting and ventilation would be achieved for the two blocks of flats.

The whole complex consists of seven two-bedroom apartments, three of which are 90sg.m. and are in front of the complex, and the other four are 75sq.m. and are located at the back side of the complex. There is also space for garage in the ground floor and in the basement.

The style of the complex is requested to be modern with wooden and metal elements.

The shape of the site (narrow and rectangular) was restrictive for the design of the apartments. The developer's aim was to build luxurious apartments according to the existing building regulations. A building permit was approved for the building in 2009.


THE COMPETITION BRIEF:

Room18 is a Pan-European Design competition for the interior design of a typical bedroom in a Greek four-star urban hotel with a total area of 18 – 24m2. The competition was announced on 21th of April 2016 and ended in July 2016. The competition attracted 262 submissions, by 580 contributors, from 17 countries.

The Design Concept was to help the guest to get familiar with the room space quickly. Given the fact that the guest stays in a hotel room for a short time period, he/she hasn't enough time to get familiar with space. For this reason, we designed a room that suits the guest's needs and makes him/her feel comfortable during a short stay in it. Simple and recognizable materials were chosen such as wood, cement, glass. Glass is also used to separate the bathroom from the bedroom, making the whole space visible to the guest. Hidden blinds in the ceiling provide privacy when needed. Warm colors on the walls and the fabrics complete the design concept.



The brief was to design and coordinate the whole structure for Booking.Com's stand at the HO.RE.CA 2015 hospitality exhibition. The concept was to create a stand accessible from all sides so as to attract as many visitors as possible. The circular shape served the concept perfectly. Two circular areas were created, one with a bar and some stools, where the exhibiting was to take place, while the other circle hide the functional services while at the same time hosting a low seating area. Spare stands and seats around the two circles provided additional "hangout space".

The colour scheme was based on the company logo. The hanging circular membrane lights echoed the whole concept.





I had to decide, together with the company's staff, between a number of selected spaces for the relocation of the "Booking.com" offices in Thessaloniki. I designed the new offices according to the needs and the instructions of "Booking.com". I collaborated with the staff and the company's design team in order to create a professional space that would match the company's standards.

CHALLENGES & RESPONSIBILITIES:

I had to design spaces that would satisfy the company's needs. The selected space was smaller than desired, so the initial design had to be changed to accommodate all the necessary activities. Furthermore, the design for the leisure time space had to respond to and incorporate elements of the traditional architectural style of the city of Thessaloniki.










Pantry plan


THE PROJECT BRIEF:


The aim was to implement the brief of "Booking.com" company on redesign and refurbishment of its offices in Athens. I was presented with the brief by the company's design team and I collaborated with the team to create the design proposal.

I had to organize the sub-contractor and manage the construction work outside working hours and at weekends, because the offices needed to be open during refurbishment.




The property was a small open space office and the new tenant wanted to convert it to Laboratory of Microbiology. Despite its small size, the two facades (front and back) provide sufficient physical lighting and ventilation. The space was separated into 3 rooms, the doctor's office (front), the lab (back) and the waiting room with the entrance (middle).

The design concept is inspired by Spring which is the season of expecting Summer and is full of hope. The image of the almond tree on the wall of the waiting room reminds of the season of Spring and the expectation that the future will be better. It's a way to relieve the patient's fear, while they are waiting for the test.

The colours that are used are vivid and happy in order to evoke a happy feeling in the patient. The wooden wall dividers give a warm feeling to the user. They are infilled with glass so as to let the light come through and some of them open to allow ventilation of the space. White blinds achieve the privacy when desired.

The furniture (office, cupboards, bookcase, sofa, and table) are all designed and constructed for the space of Lab. The design follows all health regulations.








The owners of the club wished to create a warm space with a panoramic view. The entertainment is achieved with drinking, dancing and flirting with each other. The bar is located in the center of the space where events take place. A Dj is also located near the bar and in the middle of the space. There is also a private space for clients seeking isolation from the other people in the club and wanting to rest on the sofa. These private spaces are constructed at higher levels to allow eye contact.


Above the bar, a truss is hung from the ceiling that serves the events, where lights, laser, and dancers can be hung. The diverse cylinders on the ceiling create a playful effect with the form and light abolishing the height limits of the space.

The colors of the space are fresh and warm. The curves create a familiar space in which everyone can see each other and can follow the events in the bar. The used materials are wood, metal and plasterboard. The grid between the private space and the club divides the two spaces without isolating them.

I was responsible for the design according to the owners' desire and the existing building regulations. Planning permission was approved in 2012.






Floor plan







The bespoke furniture design was essential for this project in the context of the offices' refurbishment. There were specific needs for the employees that had to be met during the design process.


There was a big column in the middle of the working area that could serve as a printer area. Following this concept, the team proposed furniture, made of wood and painted in the colors of the firm, to serve for the location of printers, the fax and the storage of print supplies.

Furthermore, the furniture with colored lockers serves for storage of the personal belongings of the employees. The kitchen suits the other elements of the space very well.



Bespoke furniture for Offices

The clients were looking to have their garden redesigned so that it could be used more effectively by the whole family. An outdoor seating area and separate play area were specified. The slope of the garden played a significant role in the design, as a flat outdoor space was needed without the existing fence having to be altered. The patio layout and placement of paths were influenced by the dual access to the garden from both the house (via the conservatory) and the main entrance.

The existing slope of the garden was adjusted close to the fence and where an outdoor bench with flowers was placed. The main seating area was defined by a deck which could accommodate either outdoor seating or dining furniture. The BBQ area was located close to the conservatory for convenient access to/from the kitchen. Bin storage was designed and set close to the entrance gate. A shed was added at the rear of the garden to provide extra storage space. Patio tiles and gravel were used together with grass for areas subject to heavy wear.

The whole design achieved the aim to provide an aesthetically pleasing but practical multipurpose outdoor space which could be enjoyed by all family members. The wooden elements of the deck, storage furniture and benches added a warm and intimate feel to the setting.



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
THE PROJECT BRIEF:

The brief concerns a patio design of a house near the sea, in Kalamata, in Greece. The house is surrounded by a natural environment outside the city center. The existing garden was unorganized, with many unused free spaces. The client wished to create a new landscape including a nice garden with a patio where many events would take place.

The design needed to organise the car space so that it wouldn't be annoying for the tenants and the guests. An external shower made of wood was located near the existing water tank. This space can also be used as a small platform for the kids to play. This space can also be used as a small platform for the kids to play. Under the existing stairs that lead to the house a wall with a working bench and an external sink with cupboards is designed.

The design concept is to maintain the existing shapes (circles) around the existing olive trees combined with the circular water tank. Thus, the patio is designed following arcs and curves that respect the existing elements of the landscape and are in harmony with the natural space around.

The proposed patio would be constructed by stone and cement, with a wooden deck around the water tank.
